Safety Health and Environmental Awareness (SHEA) CORE

Course Aims

To provide delegates with an appropriate level of knowledge, understanding and behavioural awareness with regards to workplace safety and environmental law.

The Safety Health and Environmental Awareness (SHEA) suite of schemes have been developed in collaboration with industry to provide a uniform approach to health, safety and environmental awareness training across the utilities sector, in line with Health and Safety Executive guidelines. It is a passport scheme and does not indicate any level of technical competence or skilled expertise.

Who Should Attend?

The SHEA Core scheme is designed for those who require access to operational sites, both permanent and temporary, at all levels including operatives, supervisors and managers.

Certification

Delegates will need to complete all six modules and pass the SHEA Core assessment to receive the SHEA Core registration, valid for 3 years.

SHEA is a CSCS Partner scheme, meaning SHEA registration allows access to CSCS controlled sites for the purposes of utilities work. There is no additional requirement to conduct a touch-screen test or apply separately for a CSCS card, certification from the course will award the delegate with a CSCS certified card.
