



MATS Rooftop Worker Safety & Access



Course Aim

The aim of this course is to provide delegates with the knowledge and skills to safely access and work upon flat rooftops.

This course is recognised by the Mast and Tower Safety Group (MATS) and forms part of the telecom's climber passport.

Please note: This course does not qualify delegates to work upon pitched or fragile rooftops.

We also provide a 3 day [MATS Initial Basic Tower Climber & Rescue](#) training course, which provides delegates with the skills and knowledge required to safely use personal fall protection equipment whilst climbing, operate permanently installed fixed safety systems and additional fall prevention equipment.



Who Should Attend?

This course is suitable for those delegates who are required to work within the telecommunications and broadcast industry, as well as others.

Pre-requirements on the day

- Delegates must be 18 years and over.
- All delegates must be able to certify they are physically fit and have no medical conditions that might prevent them working at height prior to commencement of training.



Course Duration

This is a 1 day course.
